

Two Big Needs for the Camp

1) A bigger tractor. Did you know that the majority of our 40 acres is mowed with a 5 foot wide finish mower. Our little 20 horse power tractor is a good one but we could really use something with at least 55 horses that could pull a 12 foot batwing mower and that has a front end loader to help with a variety of chores. All of this together would cost \$30,000 plus. Please pray about this and see how you might could help make this a reality in 2013.



2) A campus wide speaker system. Right now we have no way of sending a message out to the entire campus at once which is often needed. We have nearly 15 individual locations where campers can be and tracking people down for messages can be quite a challenge. The price (\$12,000 plus) of this project too has kept it from being a reality but I am sure that someone can help make this happen this year too.

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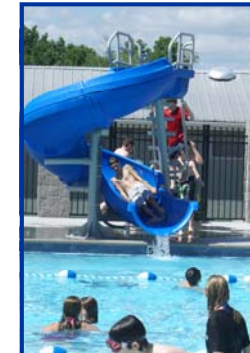
