Retreat Center - Phase I - Paid in Full

SPECIAL ANNOUNCEMENT:

As most of you know we embarked on a building program several years ago that included a Retreat Center. Originally, the estimated cost for the Retreat Center was envisioned as some \$4,000,000. After months of study about fundraising it was decided a project of such expense would not be the best decision. Based upon this thinking the Retreat Center planning was divided into phases. The first phase is complete and, praise the Lord, it is now paid in full.

How was this pay off accomplished? The Lord blessed us all along the way. We were able to construct a \$1.2 million facility at a cost of approximately \$800,000. Due to the generosity of all the camp supporters, less than one-half (\$350,000) of the total spent had to be borrowed. We paid \$4100 a month payment on the loan and reduced the balance to under \$300,000 when we received the news that a sister in one of our supporting churches had honored the Camp with a significant portion of her estate which eliminated our debt. We praise God for Josephine Carter, along with her husband Clarence, who are examples to all of us as to what an incredible difference one can make for the cause of Jesus Christ.



We are now planning to move to another phase of the Retreat Center. Two phases remain, a new dining facility on one side of the center and a wing of new hotel style rooms on the other side. The building committee is in the process of costing out these next phases and how best to proceed. Meanwhile, the estate is not completely settled, so it remains to be seen exactly how much more we will get to apply to the next phase of the Retreat Center as wished by Josephine. Just as soon as the estate is settled, we will issue another statement apprising everyone of our financial position as related to the Retreat Center construction program.


The Board has prayer requests concerning this construction. First, that they will make decisions that are best for the Camp and keep the Lord in the forefront of all the camp does; second, that churches and individuals will not withdraw their support from the Retreat Center with the idea that we have completed the project; and finally the receipt of this amazing gift will not be divisive, as we know this is what the devil desires most.


We hope to have at one-half to two-thirds of the cost of the next phase in the bank prior to breaking ground. If we continue to pull together as we have done for the first phase, the next phase can be a reality very soon!

Summer Camp Update and Statistics

The 2008 summer camp season alone included 20 different camp sessions for an unprecedented number of programs squeezed into two months. Next year, we are planning even more! During just this summer season we had a total of 1013 campers plus 336 faculty helping to run the programs. We are so grateful to the deans and faculty of each week knowing just how much they give to the students and the ministry. Forty-nine different Christian Churches were represented in the campers along with many others who took part this year. Fairdale Christian Church received the highest in attendance with 81 campers which was 20 more than last year (Way to Go Fairdale)! Okolona came in at a close 2nd with 75, Fern Creek 73 and First Christian-E'town sent 65 campers.

We are most excited about the decisions that were made this past summer proving once again just how effective Christian Camping is in meeting the spiritual needs of our young people. Whatever it takes, make sure you stay involved because as you can see, Christian Camping changes lives!

In addition to camp scholarships they provide ministry scholarships to those attending our Bible Colleges while training for full time ministry.

To BYKOTA we say thank you as you open doors for many individuals. The generosity of our churches and individuals seems to grow more daily as together we work as one in the Lord's work!

The annual BYKOTA Thanksgiving fellowship meal will be held at the camp on Wednesday, November 19th. An offering will be collected for the ministry.

Swimming Pool Fund

Here is some news that will excite every single camper, because we all know how much we enjoy the swimming pool. We have started a new pool fund and have already accumulated nearly \$45,000. Much more will be needed if we are to enlarge our pool, enhance it with additional water park features, and make it handicapped accessible with a zero entry access. We hope to have a final plan and cost in place soon so that we can all share this common goal.

All of this is needed because after 40 years of use our current pool is in desperate need of help and is in many ways outdated. Forty years ago a vision was realized that has provided a wonderful pool for many to enjoy



and now we hope to have the vision and means by which to provide an even safer, more exciting pool to be used by everyone for the next several decades.
